Ideal Candidate Qualifications

- Physically fit and in good health.
- Must be able to pass a pre-employment medical examination and drug screening.
- Drivers Abstract with less than 6 demerit points.
- Safe, positive attitude.
- Willing to learn.

Training Opportunities

On-the-job training is provided to employees in one or more of the following methods:

The New Hire Orientation program

- A two-day class focusing on Halliburton's corporate culture, commitment to safety, team development, and company-specific terminology.

Safety training

- On-going training and certifications such as TDG, WHMIS, H₂S, First Aid, safe driving policies, and incident reporting.

On-the-job training

- A mentorship relationship between experienced and qualified employees and new hires for equipment operators and drivers.

Apprenticeship opportunities

- Potential opportunities to apprentice as a heavy duty mechanic.



Hours, Pay, Benefits

Positions at Halliburton are full-time and year-round.

Employees generally work a 15 days-on and 6 days-off rotational schedule.

Employees receive a base salary plus applicable bonuses that account for overtime pay.

A full benefit package is provided to employees after completing one full calendar month of employment.
