MANUFACTURING LABOURER

QUICK FACTS

- Physically demanding work.
- Full time, Monday thru Friday schedule.
- Overtime may be required.
- Must be responsible and mature.
- Working on Saturdays is often required.

NATURE OF WORK

- Materials and product handling and checking.
- Sorting and packing.
- Crate and package materials & products.
- General labourer duties related to processing and manufacturing.
- Assist other workers as required.
- Work with trades people to complete jobs.
- Heavy lifting required.
- Pushing and pulling.
- Walking and standing for long periods of time.
- Tasks as assigned by supervisor/foreman.
- Keep work areas and equipment clean.
- Work consists of both indoor and outdoor work.
- Work is at the company location.
- Work is full time and year round.
- Overtime may be available.
- Shift work may be required and may include nights and weekends.
- Depending on the company, shift work is not mandatory and employees are generally assigned to either a day or afternoon shift with no rotation.
- The hourly wage range for a manufacturing labourer is approximately \$12.00 - \$19.40 plus per hour.
- Employees can move to top rates within 12 months (depending on the company).
