Types & Nature of Work

There are a variety of employment opportunities at The Good Samaritan Society.

1. Registered Nurses (RN)

- RNs must be a graduate of a recognized School of Nursing. A B.Sc.N. and/or Gerontology certificate is preferred.
- Responsible for assessing, planning and evaluating resident care within a multi-disciplinary team.

2. Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN)

- CLPNA registration and current medication administration course is needed.
- Responsible for performing nursing and personal care duties within the scope of the College for Licensed Practical Nurses of Alberta guidelines.

3. Nursing Attendant/Health Care Aide

- HCA/RCA program completed. Experience with the elderly an asset.
- Responsible for providing resident support in personal care, medication assistance, recreation, meal service and housekeeping.

4. Assisted Living Worker

- Completion of Health Care Aide course is required. Experience in a long-term care setting is preferred.
- Provide direct support to residents in the areas of personal care, medication assistance, recreation, meal service and housekeeping.

5. Housekeeping Aide

- Experience required in institutional cleaning, including the use of floor care machines. AVC certificate an asset. In-house training is provided.
- General cleaning of resident rooms, restrooms, utility rooms, and kitchens. Process all linen in a safe and timely manner. Fold and sort linen and prepare linen carts for delivery.

6. Food Service Aide

- Completed Grade 10 education or equivalent. Related institutional food service experience desirable. Knowledge or experience in working with modified diets and special diets also desirable.
- Perform general cleaning duties including preparing tableware and utensils for dishwashing, operating dishwasher and cleaning pots. Load and unload bulk supplies. Assist with meal preparation and mealtimes in nursing units.

Ideal Candidate Qualifications

Ideal candidate qualifications are dependent upon the position, but may include:

- Completion of Grade 12
- Post-secondary education is required for all RN and LPN positions.
- A combination of education, training and work experience in a related field may be considered for a variety of positions.
- Safety tickets are required for some positions.
- A positive and caring attitude is always required.

Training Opportunities

Training opportunities are dependent upon the position. On-the-job training and coaching/mentoring is provided to all new employees of The Good Samaritan Society.

Health Care Aide training/certificate is provided in a number of locations.

First Aid and CPR training are available through The Good Samaritan Society.

Ongoing education and training through in-house education services is provided to all staff.

Hours, Pay, Benefits

Employment opportunities are full time, part-time, and casual. A benefits plan is available to all full time and most part time positions.

Facilities operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Hours of work vary depending on shift positions within a program or facility.

A clear and current Criminal Records check is required for all new employees.

The Good Samaritan Society is an equal opportunity employer and encourages applications from all qualified individuals.

How to Apply
